

## **ENVS 607 Interdisciplinary Research Seminars**

### **Purpose**

To facilitate Environmental Studies graduate students in getting to know some of the core and affiliated faculty of the Environmental Studies program and to encourage graduate students to gain exposure to a range of interdisciplinary work being done at the University of Oregon or by visitors to the UO. This course may be used for one of the twelve credits of electives required for the Masters degree in ENVS.

### **Requirements**

1. Attend at least eight research talks during Fall term given by UO or visiting faculty doing research that is interdisciplinary in nature and pertinent to environmental studies.
2. Prior to each seminar, send Alan:
  - A. the name of the speaker, title of the talk, date, time and location
  - B. a link to the speaker's academic website if such a site exists
  - C. a one or two sentence synopsis of the work she or he does and how it relates to your interests and/or to environmental studies.
3. Within a week following the talk, send to Alan a one page elaboration of part C above and include information from the speaker's presentation.

All files sent to Alan should be in Word readable format (.doc or .docx) and should use this file naming convention:

Yourlastname.Speakerlastname.pre or post.doc(x)

For example, if I were going to hear Erin Moore, I would be sending two documents (one before the seminar, and one after)

- Dickman.Moore.Pre.doc
- Dickman.Moore.Post.doc
